GO MAKE DISCIPLES—LENT—ALMSGIVING

This week we will continue discussing the three traditional pillars of Lent. As a reminder, these three pillars are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This week we will be looking deeper at almsgiving during Lent.

God is present within all of us. For many reasons unique to each person's story we all are very different. Through our faith, we are called to love everyone. This should not just be a feeling we hold inside ourselves. Love requires action and work. Almsgiving is a perfect example of showing love for others and for God.



Recently, we had a Gospel reading where Jesus emphasizes the importance of serving those in need which is a form of almsgiving. Rereading this Gospel can help us better understand what this looks like.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 25: 31-46, "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply,' Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.' Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

To help you think of where you may have more opportunity to give, here are some examples of almsgiving: giving money to a charity, driving someone to their appointments, donating clothing or baby items to someone in need, call someone that you haven't connected with lately, write a letter to someone, or introduce yourself to new members at your parish. Let us pray that we remember that God is always with us and with those around us.
